

Milo Community School Council Meeting Thursday April 14, 2022 Location: Milo School Library/Zoom

Agenda – added yearbook to new business, added to fish program to old business. Adopted.

Chad called the meeting to order at 5:01 pm.

Jana read the minutes from the March 16, 2022 meeting. No errors or omissions.

#### Palliser Deputy Super Intendent/Human Resources: Audrey Kluin

Audrey Kluin was sick, so joined the meeting via zoom to go over the Principal hiring process, which goes as follows:

1. Notification to the school and school community. Parents had received an e-mail from Kerry on March 22 stating that Kerry Aiken's Principal contract ends at the completion of this school year, and Palliser would like to go in a different direction with the leadership at Milo School moving forward.

2. Feedback for Principal Leadership profile sent to staff and parents. Audrey emailed survey on March 24 with an initial deadline of March 28. Survey/feedback can still be completed if you wish to do so at <a href="https://forms.gle/b4pkWqVz4P75mnFV6">https://forms.gle/b4pkWqVz4P75mnFV6</a>

3. Job posted, and drafted utilizing feedback from staff and parents. Job was posted March 29. Position was posted on Palliser website and Apply to Education (a world wide web based job posting site).

4. Posting is set to close after Easter. Then they start short listing for possible candidates to interview. If no one short listed then job is posted again.

5. Interview panel consists of Audrey, Superintendent or Deputy-Superintendent, board chair (Lorelei), local school board trustee (also Lorelei), and Milo school council chair. Minimum of 4 people interviewed. Have 20 present questions. LQS Leadership Quality Standards have to be met in an evaluation. They will provide time for school council chair to ask a question or two. Questions must be vetted by Audrey. Interview must be completed in one hour timeframe.

6. After interview – the interview panel submits feedback. Senior leadership make final decision. Information about candidates are highly confidential and declined applicant's names and info cannot be shared.

7. Select candidate and offer contract.

Audrey asked about job posting that had a start date, but no end date. Audrey said first year is probationary. Pending evaluation then the Principal can be offered another 1 year probation or a 3-4 year term contract. Once hit 5 years then the contract has to be a permanent contract per the ATA. ### Palliser Report: Lorelei Bexte See attached for full report

- Partnering with several Universities/Collages to offer Dual Credit Courses for High School Students. Dual Credit courses allow students to take post-secondary courses during high school, earning both post-secondary credit and high school credit. Tuition is paid by Palliser. Students have an opportunity to explore a field of study they are interested in, easing the transition to postsecondary and helping confirm or redirect their plans.
- Five schools are currently piloting a Transition to Life course will be offered in Grade 12 (basically CALM on steroids). Two schools are piloting a culinary course and FarmEd offers an immersive, place-based education centered on Agricultural practices and "farm to table".
- Wellness. In the past year there has been an increase in Family School Liaison Counselors (FSLC). Currently a job ad is out looking for a shared FSLC for Milo.

- a) Yearend Awards:

- Discussed Honor Roll Awards. Did not present last year as it was hard to do accurate marks with online learning and the extra assistance provided by teachers. Milo School Council would like to sponsor the Honor Roll Plaques. For every student in Grades 1-9 that achieves 80%+ in the four core subjects. For Grades 1-3, where it is harder to do a %, will do high 3's and 4 from the report cards.
- discussed how parents don't like the current report cards with the 1-4 system. 4 being 90%+ and a 3 being a 70-89%. Lorelei will look into the report card guidelines.
- Last day of school is a half day, dismissal approx 12:15 pm. So will do the awards late morning, then students can go home with parents if they want. No lunch/hamburgers needed.
- b) Lunchtime microwaves. Discussed microwaves and lunchroom. Decided that microwaves will be moved into the classrooms starting the 1<sup>st</sup> week in May.
- c) Marine Biology Trip for spring 2023? Discussed. Should be 15 students in Jr. High next year. Parents at the meeting would be willing to come up with \$1000 per student for costs + fundraising. Jana will get quotes from Bluewater Adventures.
- d) Yearbook Bernie doing yearbook again this year. Send pictures to Tammy Lahd if you have any pictures from this school year. Cost is \$30 each, with people paying \$20 each per yearbook. The school covers the extra cost. Next year will get advertising/sponsors for the yearbook (start looking for sponsors sooner).
- e) Community Garden Bernie asking the ATA for seeds and timer for watering. Quincy and Bernie going to till it. Students start planting May 19, plant potatoes, onions, carrots, etc. Will need to set up a watering/weeding schedule for this summer.
- f) Field trip Quincy looking into the Calgary Zoo. Head Smashed in Buffalo Jump is only offering school trips for ½ days, so not worth the bus trip. And have went to Tyrell Museum a bunch already.
- g) Lake Day for Grades 1-6 will be Monday June 27. Grades 7-9 are going to Lethbridge YMCA for Grade 9 grad fun day. School council can help with the cost if grads don't raise enough money with bake sales and school bottles.
